Always looking for new oenologic experiences, in 2011 Jean-Luc Thunevin started to grow almost 1 hectare of Chardonnay on a clayey limestone plot, with a South East exposition and neighbouring the plots dedicated to the production of the white versions of Chateau Valandraud and Virginie de Valandraud (made from traditional Bordeaux grape white varieties).

Manual harvest, 3 successive picking according to maturity

Yield 50 hl / ha

Average Production 4 000 bottles

Alcoholic fermentation in 1/3 new barrels, 1/3 1 wine barrels,

And 1/3 2 wine barrels

Ageing « sur lies » in barrels during 12 months

The 2015 Bad Boy Chardonnay has a crisp lime flower, pear and nectarine-scented bouquet that is fresh and generous. The palate is well balanced with a crisp line of acidity, some fatness emerging on the finish, the saline streak leading you back to take another sip. Simple yet charming. But hey, that's not how bad boys are supposed to act, are they?
